




This celebration of the 25th Anniversary of the Jesuit Institute for Family Life Network is indeed a celebration of Christ's

grace and love, guidance and providential strength to free God's People to live lives of love and service to one another in The call to follow Christ into homes began in the beginning of my second year novitiate in 1961 when I just had turned marriage and family life.

19 years old. I was riding in the car with the Master of Novices from Los Gatos to San Francisco. On the way up to San Francisco that Sunday afternoon from Los Gatos we came into the southern extremity of "the city." This was the Westlake area where many many homes are right next to each other in neat long rows. Somehow for the period of about 45 seconds I found my head up and my eyes opening. I gazed out at the houses all in a row right next to each other. As this happened I felt the presence of Christ within me saying, "Bob, do you see all the pain in those houses... in the living rooms, the kitchens, the bedrooms, the family rooms?" And Christ showed me the pain there. I said in response, "Yes, Lord." Christ

within me said, "Will you do something about that." I said, "OK."

All of that took about 45 seconds.

ear Friends,

I devoted myself to studies to prepare myself to answer that call within a call I began doing marriage, family, and child counseling here at the Jesuit Retreat House in 1976 when I arrived there in the fall. I began to gather marriage counselors and family therapists who were interested in interfacing the event of psychotherapy with the history of ascetical theology in the church, especially, that of St. Ignatius Loyola. So began the Jesuit

Since then I have experienced the same movement of Christ as I did in the Novitiate some forty-one years ago in found-Institute For Family Life Network in the beginning of 1977. ing each of these institutes. It is the same Christ, the same call. I have come to understand that it is Christ suffering on the

Cross now in my sisters and brothers that cries out to me from these houses and these homes. It is Christ asking to be comforted as He suffers here that I and the lay men and women, Jesuits and Sisters in this work are responding to. What is clear to me is that this is the idea, the desire, and the work of Christ. It is the desire of Christ that men and women

live together in peace, that children and parents live in peace, and that homes be a place of love, nurturing, and peace for all. I am surprised who God is in Christ. I am surprised at what God is concerned about. This is God's interest. And in follow-

ing Christ I have come to learn who Jesus really is and what Jesus really cares about and wants for His People. It is wonderful. The "subtitle" of this JIFL Network is "Counseling in the Jesuit Tradition". Over the years what this has come to mean

is that the event of psychotherapy in human history has offered us the discovery of the "unconscious". This simple insight has impacted ascetical theology in a way that the classical works "on the attainment of the moral virtues", "on the practice of Christian Perfection", and "on the changing of bad habits to good habits" have worked at.

The discovery of the unconscious as an active player in human behavior has afforded us with an effective tool in our quest

to understand ourselves and one another as we attempt to follow Christ. It is Jesus who is in charge of the meaning of human life, even the meaning of holiness, not you and I. And Jesus in Matthew 25 says that "if you give to these sisters and brothers of mine you give to Me". In this Jesus defines prayer, the lifting of our hearts and minds to God, as every move we make to share what we have with our brothers and sisters. This situates every move a person makes in psychotherapy to

share themselves with their spouse, their children, their parents, as prayer... lifting one's heart and mind to God. In this respect the psychotherapeutic quest functions as an extension of "the examination of consciousness" of St. Ignatius

Loyola's Spiritual Exercises and identifies the works as "counseling in the Jesuit tradition". This integration is not simple, as you know, but it does belie why Christ is so intent on this freedom, love, and peace

being in the hearts of each of His Children.

It is this that has attracted so many lay men and women, Jesuits and Sisters to be on the staffs of these institutes. The heart of the work is the Sacrament of the Eucharist that we celebrate at each staff meeting. It is tending the broken Body of Christ in these families that we are doing. It is answering the call of Christ that has formed this work and continues to

On the Network

Is your marriage what you want it to be? Are you struggling to express your need for your spouse? Are your children suffering from your lack of communication with your partner? Has your spouse left you emotionally? Have you tried to solve problems like these and found you could not do it alone? This need has given rise to the Jesuit Institute for Family Life Network: staffs of competantly prepared and professionally skilled counselors and therapists whose training and interest is in dealing with these questions and areas of growth in family living.

The Jesuit Institute for Family Life Network is a response, then, to a need within families to value the quality of intra-family relationships. To want to value one's spouse and family members is often quite different from actually performing in a way that effectually expresses such value. We find that new skills are often needed and old obstacles to growth must be understood and worked through before effective human relating can be realized.

The Jesuit Institute for Family Life Network provides marriage counseling, individual counseling, family counseling, and group counseling for married couples as means to realizing this desired sense of value.

As a staff our experience shows that talking out one's inner feelings within the counseling process is necessary and an effective way to deal with many personal and interpersonal problems. Out of our training we see this process of counseling to be a normal way to deal with the complicated stress that the modern world brings to bear on contemporary family life.

These staffs are a professional team resource. We meet for case consultations, provide a stimulating professional milieu, and call upon other professionals in the fields of psychiatry, family law, moral and ethical questions, clinical psychology, and spirituality for frequent consultations. This provides a community of interested experts working together to serve the family as such a task warrants and demands.

These staffs are made up of competant counselors and therapists who are Catholic in religious orientation perceiving marriage as a sacrament. We perceive that in relating to one another we relate to Christ as Christ said, "If you give to these sisters and brothers of mine you give to Me." [Matthew 25:40] In saying this Christ is defining and identifying prayer as every movement we make to be our true selves and every movement we make to share ourselves with one another. This means that every stride an individual makes in therapy to be themselves and share themselves is a movement toward God... a raising of one's heart and mind... one's self... to God. It is our opinion, then, that this counseling process is a movement toward God and as such functions as an extension of the ascetical practice of the examination of consciousness. We consider this to be the context, the underpinnings, and the ambiance of the therapeutic work we do.

We serve a wide range of age groups, races, and socio-economic and educational backgrounds reflecting the rich variety of families. We serve a variety of problems arising between husband and wife and within the family, from everyday life stress to more long term relational and interpersonal difficulties. We continue to be available to serve you.
